



Obtaining Your Concealed Carry Permit for Colorado

Once you have earned a certificate of completion, there are a few more steps to obtain your permit to carry in Colorado. This document will cover resident and non-resident applications, the materials you will need, where and how to apply, state reciprocity, and links to Colorado laws and guidelines.

Is a Concealed Carry Permit Required in Colorado?

Colorado is a “shall issue” state. Concealed carry permits are issued to county residents by local sheriff’s offices.

Steps to Acquire a Colorado Concealed Carry Permit

To qualify you must:

- Be at least 21 years of age.
- Be a legal resident of Colorado.
- Not have been convicted of perjury.
- Not chronically and habitually use alcoholic beverages.
- Not be an unlawful user of or addicted to a controlled substance.
- Not be subject to a protection order.
- Demonstrate competence with a handgun. Presently, Colorado accepts online firearms training. However, Colorado residents must demonstrate competence with a handgun to an instructor as well.
- Meet federal law requirements (<https://www.usconcealedcarry.com/resources/federal-ccw-law/federally-prohibited-persons/>).
- Download here (<https://www.colorado.gov/pacific/sites/default/files/Concealed%20Handgun%20Permit%20Application.pdf>) or pick up an application form at your county sheriff’s office. To locate your county sheriff’s office check: <https://coloradosheriffs.org/resources/counties/>
- Include payment in cash, credit card, money order or certified check for \$52.50. This includes the cost of a fingerprint and background check.



Once the application process is complete, the local sheriff must grant or deny the concealed carry permit within ninety days.

State Reciprocity

Acquiring a concealed carry permit allows you to every day carry a concealed weapon in Colorado. In addition, Colorado will recognize a valid concealed carry permit issued by another state if:

- That state honors a Colorado permit.
- The permit holder is a resident of the issuing state.
- The permit holder has a current driver's license or a State ID showing residency of that state.
- The permit holder is 21 years of age or older.
- The permit holder has a valid CCW permit.

Colorado does not recognize a concealed carry permit issued by any state to a nonresident of that state.

Resident and Non-Resident Application

Some states have different requirements and guidelines for resident and non-resident concealed carry permits. Colorado issues resident permit. The only non-resident permits issued are to members of the military permanently stationed in Colorado and their immediate family members.

Residents

1. Complete a weapons safety and training course in person or online at a Colorado-approved facility or website.
2. Prove to a qualified instructor that you are competent with a handgun.
3. Obtain a certificate of completion of the course.
4. Download or pick up an application form. If you want a Colorado handgun Carry Permit, you must visit a full service Driver License Station. For a list of locations visit <https://www.tn.gov/content/tn/safety/driver-services/locations.html>.
5. Include the following documents:
 - Provide proof of legal Colorado residency (e.g., certified birth certificate or valid U.S. Passport). Check to see which other documents suffice by clicking on: <https://www.tn.gov/content/tn/safety/driverservices/classd/dlcitizen.html>.
 - Include payment in cash, credit card, money order or certified check for \$52.50.



- Once the application process is complete, the sheriff has ninety days to confirm or deny your Colorado concealed carry permit.

Non-Residents

Colorado non-residents can apply for the Virginia Non-Resident Concealed Handgun Permit to qualify for their CCW training. It is no longer valid in Colorado but it is a great alternative for Colorado residents and non-residents who wish to visit other states.

How to Apply for a Virginia Non-Resident Permit

To apply for your Virginia non-resident permit visit:

1. Complete firearms training course at an accredited sight like National Carry Academy (<http://nationalcarryacademy.com>).
2. Download and print a certificate of successful completion.
3. Apply to Virginia website. See (<http://nationalcarryacademy.com>). For details.
4. If you have questions, contact the state of Virginia (www.vsp.state.va.us).

Click on "firearms/concealed handguns".

Click on the "Nonresident Concealed Handgun Permits" link.

This will bring you to a page that details the application process.

Begin the application process immediately by downloading the checklist of all documents that need to be prepared to make your application.
